Research question(s):

Does reducing EHR mouse clicks on ordering tasks for PCPs improve time spent on orders and perceived satisfaction with the EHR?

Brief Background/Significance:

PCPs spend a significant amount of time on the EHR, which is not optimized for their use. We want to assess whether efforts to reduce clicks will improve time spent and satisfaction with the EHR, and to establish a benchmark of daily clicks for a PCP.

Data collection on all clinical practitioners who had clinical sessions at DGIM during both July 2022 and (anticipated) July 2023.
